Key objectives (2022-2027)

The PCC is working so that by 2027

- Members of the congregation have a strong sense of St Lawrence's purpose and actively contribute to its mission
- A new pastoral team is offering care and support for the whole congregation, including home communions, home visits and healing ministry
- A priest-resourced, volunteer-led, differentiated offer is in place for children
- There is dedicated administrative support for worship, parish communications and pastoral work, enabling clergy time to focus on ministerial tasks
- A costed ten-year strategic development plan provides the basis for an annual budget, stewardship appeals and grant bids
- The church building is light, warm and safe, providing an attractive space for worship, for a range of meetings and for community events (Heating replaced, lighting renewed, AV upgraded, flooring resurfaced, furnishings refreshed)
- A budgeted plan for whole site redevelopment has been formulated in response to community audit
- A network of relationships has been established with a range of community stakeholders which are bringing benefit and enrichment to both partners (including schools, local care homes and businesses)
- Transparent systems are in place which keep us and our community secure and safe

We continue to provide a Christian witness in this community, offering resource for stability and integration for lives shaped through encounter with difference, adaptation to change, and evolutionary growth.


